

Cost of Attendance

Determining Financial Need

During the award process, the cost of attendance is compared to the student's expected family contribution to determine financial need. The amounts listed on the COA chart are estimates and it is possible to attend Trinidad State Junior College for less than the amounts listed.

Estimating Educational Expenses

This Cost of Attendance (COA) chart is an estimate of the educational expenses of students enrolled during the academic year (fall, spring and/or summer semesters). These estimates include direct charges (tuition and fees) and indirect expenses (transportation, books, supplies, miscellaneous living expenses, and room and board). Due to the state of Colorado's legislative process, actual tuition figures may be different from those shown here. (This example below reflects a student attending for 9 months, i.e. fall/spring.)
