



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

Adams State University (ASU)

Trinidad State College (TSC)

Purpose:

This agreement is to articulate the Trinidad State College (TSC) Associate of Arts degree with the Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology: Sport and Recreation Management Emphasis offered at Adams State University (ASU).

Process

TSC will provide current degree requirements for the AA degree, specifying the general education required courses and the required courses for the AA. ASU will provide the Kinesiology course requirements and any remaining requirements for the BS degree.

Students must complete a total of 120 hours to graduate from ASU with a BS; 42 hours must be at the upper-division level. Students transferring in an AA degree must complete at least one course in each general education area. These requirements are specified in the degree plan.

Conditions:

- 1. The student will provide to ASU documentation showing that the student has successfully completed (grade of "C" or better) articulated coursework, and that the student has graduated from TSC with the AA degree;
- 2. The courses included in this agreement may be used to meet the course requirements for the BS in Kinesiology: Sport and Recreation Management Emphasis;
- 3. Students must enroll at ASU within 10 years of completion of TSC articulated coursework in order to apply articulated courses to the degree;
- 4. No tuition will be assessed for articulated credits.

Renewal, Revision and Termination:

- This agreement is effective August 1, 2024, and shall remain in place until revised or terminated.
- Either institution, upon written notice to the other institution, may revise this agreement.
- Either institution, at any time during its term, may accomplish termination of this agreement by giving written notice to the
 other institution. Termination notice shall not be given less than sixty (60) days prior to the end of the current term of the
 agreement.

LIMITATIONS

- 1. Completion of Associate Degree: This transfer guide identifies the courses a student needs to complete (with a C or higher) to earn an AA degree at TSC in order to be able to finish the designated baccalaureate degree in no more than 60 credits. Per Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CCHE) Policy I, L, students who complete an AA or AS degree at a Colorado community/junior college and who are admitted to a Colorado public baccalaureate institution are guaranteed the following: the full transfer and application of a minimum of 60 credits toward the baccalaureate degree requirements at the Colorado institution of higher education; completion of the lower-division component of the receiving institution's general education core curriculum; and junior standing. Course credit may be applied to major, elective or other requirements at the receiving institution's discretion. If more than 60 college-level credits are taken or the student gets lower than a C- in one or more courses at the community/junior college, then some loss of transfer credit may occur, and students may not be able to complete this baccalaureate degree in 120 credits.
- 2. **Transfer Before Completing the Associate Degree:** If the student intends to transfer prior to completing the AA degree, this transfer guide should still be used to identify the courses that can most effectively prepare them for efficiently completing the designated major at the baccalaureate institution to which they are transferring. While not completing the required associate degree eliminates the guarantees described here, gtPathways general education courses identified herein are guaranteed to transfer and apply to the receiving institution's gtPathways lower division general education requirements. Students are strongly encouraged to finish course sequences (such as BIO 2102 and 2102) before transferring.
