



between Adams State University (ASU) and Trinidad State College (TSC)

Purpose:

This agreement is to articulate the Trinidad State College (TSC) Law Enforcement Training Academy Associate of Applied Science degree with the BA in Sociology: Criminology Emphasis offered at Adams State University (ASU).

Process:

TSC will provide current degree requirements for the AAS degree in Basic Law Enforcement, specifying the general education required courses and the required courses for the AAS. ASU will provide the Sociology course requirements and any remaining requirements for the BA degree.

Students must complete a total of 120 hours to graduate from ASU with a B.A.; 42 hours must be at the upper-division level. Students transferring in an AAS degree must complete at least one course in each general education area. These requirements are specified in the degree plan.

Conditions:

- 1. The student will provide to ASU documentation showing that the student has successfully completed (grade of "C" or better) articulated coursework, and that the student has graduated from TSC with the AAS degree in Law Enforcement Training Academy;
- 2. The courses included in this agreement may be used to meet the course requirements for the Bachelor of Arts in Sociology: Criminology Emphasis;
- 3. Students must enroll at ASU within 10 years of completion of TSC articulated coursework in order to apply articulated courses to the degree;
- 4. No tuition will be assessed for articulated credits.

Renewal, Revision and Termination:

- This agreement is effective August 1, 2024, and shall remain in place until revised or terminated.
- Either institution, upon written notice to the other institution, may revise this agreement.
- Either institution, at any time during its term, may accomplish termination of this agreement by giving written notice to the other institution. Termination notice shall not be given less than sixty (60) days prior to the end of the current term of the agreement.
