The NRA Concealed Carry Course is intended for all individuals who seek to apply for a Colorado concealed carry permit regardless of previous shooting experience or NRA affiliation. Students are required to bring a handgun (pistol or revolver), 2 extra magazines or 2 speed loaders, a spare magazine pouch, a strong-side holster, 150 rounds of ammunition, eye and ear protection.

Beginning Fly Fishing

This course will provide a basic and broad overview of fly fishing February 15 - April 18 Thursdays 4-5 p.m.

This course will cover the history of fly fishing and the pros and cons of fly fishing, gear and supplies, flies - types and buying versus tying flies, casting and presenting, needs of fish, trout food and entomology.

\$165 for students who provide their own equipment \$315 if you do not own your own equipment, we will provide the equipment for you to keep. (fly rod, reel, case, line, leader, spool of tippet, nail knot tool, nippers, hemostats, fly box with 10 flies) There is a once-per-semester registration fee of \$16.30.

Instructor: Daniel Castellano has been a professional fly fishing guide in New Mexico and Colorado for 14 years and won back-to-back fishing competitions on the Conejos River in 2017-18. He also served as the fishing program coordinator and head fishing guide at a premier hospitality ranch in northern New Mexico.
