Most likely the last time you used a trail, you didn't think about the planning, vision, and hard work that went into creating it. For a trail builder, carrying a project from an idea to a completed project can be extremely rewarding.

According to "Comparably", the average trail builder's salary in Colorado Springs is \$92,974 while the U.S. average is \$81,387 (ranging from \$36,495 to \$359,072). Additionally, the economic impact of outdoor recreation in Colorado has surged to \$17.2 billion, a 24% increase from the last year.

Now is the perfect time if you are considering a career in trail building or just want to join the local efforts to increase or improve the trails in and around Trinidad. Trinidad State is reviving its popular trail building program in the form of non-credit, short-term, trails-related workshops.
