Reporting to the Financial Aid Director this position provides a high level of support to students navigating the Financial Aid process. Administers federal, state and institutional aid programs in compliance with federal and state laws, regulations and industry standards. Implements and supports department policies and procedures. Maintains up-to-date knowledge of proposed and current legislation, and informs supervisor and the Vice President of all changes that may impact financial aid programs and student enrollment. Collaborates in the development and maintenance of the TSC financial aid data base system and website, including provision of consumer information for prospective and new students. Responsible for SAP appeals, policy and procedure compliance.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Manage all aspects of financial aid programs, ensuring compliance with all federal and state laws, regulations and guidelines as well as all college policies and procedures
- Monitor, approve and/or revise all financial aid packaging for all qualified applicants in accordance with federal, state, institutional and other policies and procedures.
- Oversee coordination of student loan processing between students and the financial aid office.
- Work with the Business Office to ensure accurate and timely exchange of information and awards.
- Provide a high level of customer service to students, parents and the public.
- Answers a high volume of phone calls, emails and video follow up related to the Financial Aid process for students
- Collaborate to ensure timely disbursement of financial aid funds and timely student refunds.
- Assist with the appeal process including collecting student documentation, related to SAP
- Develop and conduct financial aid presentations and participate in outreach activities in the community
- Assists student veterans, including collecting documentation, to apply for veterans' benefits
- Oversee the development, design, revision and update all publications (website, college catalog and related media) relating to financial aid, such as financial aid applications, forms used for tracking applications, correspondence forms and brochures.
- Counsel and provide timely feedback to students and parents regarding financial needs and problems, and recommend financial aid opportunities and provide counsel on procedures and academic eligibility.

- Understands and demonstrates the importance of communication and customer service.
- Experience providing comprehensive assistance for complex processes.
- Understanding of the mission of the community college and programs typically offered at a community college.

- Proven ability to work as a team player, appropriately exhibiting a positive attitude and sense of humor.
- Demonstrated management, interpersonal, and organizational skills;
- Polished communication skills both oral and written;
- Commitment to working with a diverse population;
- Active participation in community programs including civic, charity, or professional organizations; other functions; and
- Willingness to travel in-state or out-of-state.

Salary:

Salary range is \$41,000-\$43,000 based on a 12-month appointment and successful candidate's qualifications and experience. Benefit package including retirement and health insurance is available.

About Trinidad, Colorado

A well-known landmark, Fisher's Peak, overlooks the City of Trinidad, which is nestled in a valley surrounded by pion-studded hills. Located 185 miles south of Denver, and just 15 miles north of the New Mexico border on Interstate Highway 25, Trinidad abounds in a panorama of mountain beauty. Ski slopes are within a 60-minute drive from the campus. Trinidad's nine-hole golf course is one of the best in the state. Trinidad Lake State Park, Bear, Blue, Monument and North lakes all offer outstanding fishing, boating, camping, hiking and outdoor recreation opportunities. Having a population of approximately 10,000, Trinidad is known for the convenience and friendliness of small-town living. The area is unexcelled for its moderate, dry climate.

About Alamosa, Colorado

The Trinidad State College Valley Campus is located in the San Luis Valley, which consists of six counties. Located in a broad, mostly flat valley, as much as 100 miles long and 75 miles wide, with an elevation of 7,500 feet at the Valley floor, the region is rimmed by high mountains to the north, east, and west, with elevations up to 14,345 feet. The Rio Grande River rises in the western part of the region and flows south into New Mexico. The region has an area of 8,180 square miles and a population of approximately forty thousand people.

Highway transportation in the Valley includes U.S. Highway 285, traversing the Valley from north to south, and U.S. Highway 160, which connects the Valley with Interstate 25 to the east. Rail service to many communities in the region is provided by the Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad. Alamosa is served by a commercial airline with daily flights to Denver and New Mexico cities.

Scenic and recreational attractions are another major resource of the San Luis Valley including the Great Sand Dunes National Monument; Wolf Creek Ski Area; Rio Grande and Gunnison National Forests; San Luis, the oldest city in Colorado; Conejos, with the oldest church; the old mining town of Creede; and the Narrow-Gauge Railroad, which runs between Antonito, Colorado and Chama, New Mexico over spectacular Cumbres Pass. Surrounding the Valley are the San Juan and Sangre de Cristo mountain ranges, with nine peaks rising above 14,000 feet.
