POSITION SUMMARY:

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and through a partnership with the Colorado Rural Workforce Consortium and the COResponds Grant, this position will be cleaning and disinfecting high touch and occupied areas before and after use. The physical demands of the position include, but may not be limited to, bending, kneeling, lifting, pushing, pulling, walking, and wiping. Will be using cleaners, disinfectants, sanitizers and other chemicals to clean surfaces.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Cleaning/sanitizing surfaces in workspaces and common areas after use
- Cleaning/sanitizing high-touch areas throughout the day (doors, seating, entry ways, etc.)
- Disinfecting and deep cleanings of restrooms throughout the day
- Deep cleanings of offices/classrooms with disinfectant
- Deep cleanings of restrooms with disinfectant
- Trash disposal
- Cleaning/sanitizing tables/chairs/desks in classrooms
- Cleaning/sanitizing fleet vehicles
- Cleans offices, classrooms and laboratory spaces by dust mopping, wet mopping, vacuuming carpets and furniture
- Cleans windows, chalkboards, whiteboards, walls, dusting, replacing light bulbs and floor tile
- Fills all dispensers with toilet paper, hand towels, soap, seat covers, cleans and disinfects mirrors
- Informs supervisor of repairs needed and potential hazards. Secures all buildings by locking all windows and doors at end of evening shift
- Maintains floors by stripping and waxing tile floors, spray buffing, shampooing and extracting carpets.
- Maintains and cleans custodial storage closet and maintains custodial equipment to make sure they are clean, neat and functional
- Other duties as assigned

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicants must meet one or more of the following criteria to be eligible for temporary job placement in partnership with COResponds through the Colorado Rural Workforce Consortium:

- Workers temporarily or permanently laid off as a result of the pandemic
- Self-employed individuals who are unemployed or underemployed as a result of the pandemic
- Dislocated Workers as defined under WIOA
- Long-term unemployed workers

NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

Background check and drug test is required to. Applicants will be required to wear an approved protective facemask for the entirety of their shift.

SALARY:

Hourly rate is \$14.77-\$16.33 based on experience.

About Trinidad, Colorado

A well-known landmark, Fisher's Peak, overlooks the City of Trinidad, which is nestled in a valley surrounded by pion-studded hills. Located 185 miles south of Denver, and just 15 miles north of the New Mexico border on Interstate Highway 25, Trinidad abounds in a panorama of mountain beauty. Ski slopes are within a 60-minute drive from the campus. Trinidad's nine-hole golf course is one of the best in the state. Trinidad Lake State Park, Bear, Blue, Monument and North lakes all offer outstanding fishing, boating, camping, hiking and outdoor recreation opportunities. Having a population of approximately 10,000, Trinidad is known for the convenience and friendliness of small-town living. The area is unexcelled for its moderate, dry climate.

About Alamosa, Colorado

The Trinidad State College Valley Campus is located in the San Luis Valley, which consists of six counties. Located in a broad, mostly flat valley, as much as 100 miles long and 75 miles wide, with an elevation of 7,500 feet at the Valley floor, the region is rimmed by high mountains to the north, east, and west, with elevations up to 14,345 feet. The Rio Grande River rises in the western part of the region and flows south into New Mexico. The region has an area of 8,180 square miles and a population of approximately forty thousand people.

Highway transportation in the Valley includes U.S. Highway 285, traversing the Valley from north to south, and U.S. Highway 160, which connects the Valley with Interstate 25 to the east. Rail service to many communities in the region is provided by the Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad. Alamosa is served by a commercial airline with daily flights to Denver and New Mexico cities.

Scenic and recreational attractions are another major resource of the San Luis Valley including the Great Sand Dunes National Monument; Wolf Creek Ski Area; Rio Grande and Gunnison National Forests; San Luis, the oldest city in Colorado; Conejos, with the oldest church; the old mining town of Creede; and the Narrow-Gauge Railroad, which runs between Antonito, Colorado and Chama, New Mexico over spectacular Cumbres Pass. Surrounding the Valley are the San Juan and Sangre de Cristo mountain ranges, with nine peaks rising above 14,000 feet.
