Social and Human Service Assistants - Assist in providing client services in a wide variety of fields, such as psychology, rehabilitation, or social work, including support for families. May assist clients in identifying and obtaining available benefits and social and community services. May assist social workers with developing, organizing, and conducting programs to prevent and resolve problems relevant to substance abuse, human relationships, rehabilitation, or dependent care. Employment of social and human service assistants is projected to grow 22 percent from 2012 to 2022, much faster than the average for all occupations.
