NURSING PROGRAM STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

The RN-BSN program at TS will educate students about the nursing role relating to a Baccalaureate nursing graduate which include: member of the profession; provider of Patient-Centered Care; Patient Safety Advocacy; and member of the health care team. The students will demonstrate responsibility for continued competence. They will promote the practice of professional nursing through leadership activities and advocacy. The students will provide safe and compassionate care, plans of care, and teaching plans to families, populations, and communities through many health care services. The students will use a systematic problem-solving process in the care of their patients and families based on the liberal arts, science, and evidence-based practice outcomes and research studies.

The five program student learning outcomes are:

Quality care —Interpret research to employ best practice and use data to monitor the outcomes of care, proposing an evaluation process to continuously improve the quality and safety of health care systems and deliver quality care to individuals and diverse populations. (*Domains 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9 & 10, Concepts 1, 4, 6)

Professionalism —Formulate a plan that demonstrates an enhanced commitment to professionalism, embracing excellence, caring, legal and ethical practice, civility, accountability, and professional development. (Domains 1, 2, 5, 6, 8, 9 & 10, Concepts 1, 2, 5)

Communication — Evaluate communication and collaboration with colleagues, interprofessional groups, and members of the community to promote health, safety, and well-being across the lifespan and across the continuum of healthcare environments. (Domains 1, 2, 6, 3, 8, 9 & 10, Concepts 1, 2, 3)

Leadership —Evaluate the contribution of leadership, quality improvement principles, and impact of organizational systems in transforming, managing, and coordinating safe, quality, cost-effective person-centered care. (Domains 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8 & 9, Concepts 1, 2, 3, 7, 8)

Critical thinking/Practicum reasoning —Integrate a systematic process of critical inquiry with nursing science, natural and behavioral sciences, arts, and humanities to make evidence-based practice decisions to improve the care of individuals, families, populations, and communities. (Domains 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10, Concepts 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8)

GOAL: 70% or higher over the three most recent calendar years using the projected completion date from the student plan and excluding students who have identified factors such as family obligations, relocation, financial barriers, and decisions to change major or to transfer to another institution of higher education.

RESULTS: 79% completed (44/56) **GOAL MET!**

GOAL: > 70 % of graduates surveyed will have employment as an RN within twelve (12) months of graduation.

RESULTS: 100% employed **GOAL MET!**

GOAL: 90% of employers report satisfaction with graduates on employer survey related to the new graduate's preparation to carry out the role of the Baccalaureate Nurse.
