POSITION SUMMARY:

Trinidad State College is seeking qualified applicants for a Trail Management and Construction Faculty position at the Trinidad Campus located in Trinidad, Colorado. This is full-time, nine-month, permanent position that reports directly to the Special Projects Coordinator and Vice President of Academic Affairs.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Instruct students in assigned courses in accordance with established curriculum and college procedures.
- Use effective teaching methods and technologies to meet the diverse learning styles of students.
- Maintain and distribute current course syllabi using the accepted template.
- Maintain accurate records.
- Submit grades, schedule additions, course syllabi and other reports or required documents by established deadlines.
- Be aware of and follow established polices of the State Board, CCCS, and the College.
- Assess learning outcomes, demonstrate the use of assessment results in course planning, report and maintain assessment records, and participate in assessment activities (i.e. "A" day and ALTITUDE conference).
- Develop and revise curriculum to maintain the quality and relevancy of course offerings.
- Notify the Vice President of Academic Affairs if the faculty member is going to be absent from work. This notification should be made in a timely manner.
- Discuss with appropriate personnel any problems of students, which may require special attention and provide records as needed.
- May serve as faculty advisor to student organizations and interact with students outside the classroom environment via extracurricular activities.
- Serve on college-wide committees.
- Attend all departmental, division, general faculty and staff meetings, and in-service activities.
- Participate in graduation exercises (attired in appropriate academic regalia).
- Review and select appropriate textbooks and maintain classroom supplies as needed for successful teaching of assigned classes.
- Incorporate learning resources and technologies in courses whenever possible.
- Engage in professional development activities to maintain a current knowledge of subject matter and teaching methodology.
- Meet all classes as scheduled.
- Maintain regularly scheduled office hours.
- Adhere to professional standards of conduct.
- · Other duties as assigned

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Associate of Applied Science in Construction or related field; required field experience per CCCS Administrator's Handbook guidelines.
- Must be able to teach Trail Management and Construction courses within the TSC Catalog.
- Functional knowledge of Microsoft Office Suite.
- Must be agreeable to working with a diverse population and with all ranges of student abilities; and
- Must have a strong commitment and positive attitude toward Community College instruction

NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

 The successful candidate must submit to and successfully complete a post-offer, pre-employment background check.

SALARY:

Salary is based on a full-time, 9-month appointment with a full benefit package including health, dental, vision, and retirement. Salary range is \$40,000 to \$44,000 and based on experience.

About Trinidad, Colorado

A well-known landmark, Fisher's Peak, overlooks the City of Trinidad, which is nestled in a valley surrounded by pion-studded hills. Located 185 miles south of Denver, and just 15 miles north of the New Mexico border on Interstate Highway 25, Trinidad abounds in a panorama of mountain beauty. Ski slopes are within a 60-minute drive from the campus. Trinidad's nine-hole golf course is one of the best in the state. Trinidad Lake State Park, Bear, Blue, Monument and North lakes all offer outstanding fishing, boating, camping, hiking and outdoor recreation opportunities. Having a population of approximately 10,000, Trinidad is known for the convenience and friendliness of small-town living. The area is unexcelled for its moderate, dry climate.

About Alamosa, Colorado

The Trinidad State College Valley Campus is located in the San Luis Valley, which consists of six counties. Located in a broad, mostly flat valley, as much as 100 miles long and 75 miles wide, with an elevation of 7,500 feet at the Valley floor, the region is rimmed by high mountains to the north, east, and west, with elevations up to 14,345 feet. The Rio Grande River rises in the western part of the region and flows south into New Mexico. The region has an area of 8,180 square miles and a population of approximately forty thousand people.

Highway transportation in the Valley includes U.S. Highway 285, traversing the Valley from north to south, and U.S. Highway 160, which connects the Valley with Interstate 25 to the east. Rail service to many communities in the region is provided by the Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad. Alamosa is served by a commercial airline with daily flights to Denver and New Mexico cities.

Scenic and recreational attractions are another major resource of the San Luis Valley including the Great Sand Dunes National Monument; Wolf Creek Ski Area; Rio Grande and Gunnison National Forests; San Luis, the oldest city in Colorado; Conejos, with the oldest church; the old mining town of Creede; and the Narrow-Gauge Railroad, which runs between Antonito, Colorado and Chama, New Mexico over spectacular Cumbres Pass. Surrounding the Valley are the San Juan and Sangre de Cristo mountain ranges, with nine peaks rising above 14,000 feet.
